

Five Tips for Back to School

It is time to head back to school! Here are some tips and tricks to help you, or someone(s) you know (ahem, your kids), who is heading back to school.

Tip 1: Organize, Organize, Organize!

Try to keep the space you study in clean and organized. It prevents you from getting distracted by any clutter in your space. It also allows you to spread out all your school supplies comfortably for an effective study session!

Tip 2: Have a Snack

Before you study, grab a snack! If you're hungry while studying, it can affect how well you perform and prevent you from getting the results you want. Choose something healthy like a granola bar, yogurt, fruit, or veggies.

Tip 3: Use Resources Around Us

There are many resources around our community that can help students. One of those being our local Fish Creek Library! The library offers help for students from kindergarten to Grade 12. There are book bags for kindergarten kids, and Family Read Alouds for older kids. And even your library card is free!

Tip 4: Take Breaks

Rest is important when studying or doing homework. It can help you keep a clear mind, allowing you to work more effectively. Derek Thompson of The Atlantic has reported on social science research that suggests working for 52 minutes and breaking for 17 minutes is the best rhythm for productivity. So, taking those breaks can be important – and wonderfully unproductive. During those breaks, it also helps to grab water, stretch, and move away from the space you've been studying in.

Tip 5: Get a Good Night's Sleep

Sleep and being properly rested can help you study better. It is recommended that people get on average eight hours of sleep a night to be fully rested. Research from the National Institute of Health in the United States finds without proper sleep "your ability to learn new things could drop up to 40%." So, when studying make sure your memory is sharp so you can study in optimal conditions.

It's hard to believe that we are at the end of summer already. As many of us gear up for the start of a new school year, I wanted to share some exciting news about our school system.

Alberta's population is booming and causing unprecedented growth in our education system, adding a historic number of new students across the province for the 2024-25 school year. Alberta's government recognizes and sympathizes with the challenges school authorities face with increasing enrolment, rising operational costs, and inflation. That is why it is investing an additional \$215 million to help alleviate these pressures, beginning in the 2024-25 school year. This will help alleviate these pressures, and ensure students have a comfortable place to learn with the support they need to succeed in the classroom.

Through this investment, up to 2,500 new spaces for students will be created in the 2024-25 school year, by building and installing up to 100 new modular classrooms. In addition to new modulars, the government is relocating up to 50 modular classrooms to some of Alberta's fastest growing communities in the Calgary Metropolitan Region and Edmonton, which will support up to 1,250 students. Calgary Board of Education will receive up to 31 new modular classrooms and have up to 14 relocated; Calgary Catholic School Division will receive up to 14 new modular classrooms and have up to six relocated.

School authorities can also use this additional funding to hire up to 1,000 additional teachers and classroom support staff which will help them manage class sizes, and tackle rising cost pressures without taking away from student learning.

The 2024-25 fiscal year is also promoting student success by providing a record \$9.3 billion into Alberta's education system, which is equal to \$47 million every day students are in school.

At our community cleanup, volunteers will help sort what you bring and direct you to the appropriate section to help dispose of your trash!

What Not to Bring

The DRCA community cleanup will not be accepting:

- Tires
- Household chemicals
- Liauids
- Oil
- Paint
- Freon appliances
- Glass
- Garden waste
