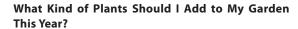
Be Water-Wise and Create a Yardsmart Yard This Spring

by the City of Calgary

As Calgary continues to experience drought conditions, we can all do our part in our yards by using water wisely. The City has a variety of YardSmart online resources and practical advice to help you establish and maintain a yard and garden that uses less water.

YardSmart Water Conservation Tips

- Mow less often to keep your grass five to seven centimetres high to shade the soil.
- Avoid watering when it has rained or if there is rain in the forecast and use a rain barrel to capture and reuse rainwater in your yard.
- Only give plants the water they need.
- Consider replacing portions of your lawn with garden features that use less water and help absorb rainwater such as rock gardens, low water-use shrubs, or groundcover.
- Add rich soil and mulch to reduce evaporation from your soil.



Native Wildflowers

The YardSmart native wildflower plant list is a great resource for those who want to expand their yards this year. These beautiful, low-maintenance plants are well-suited to Calgary's current growing conditions and attract local pollinators.

Drought conditions are likely to persist in the coming years. Creating a yard that's fit for Calgary's climate will help it fare better during future droughts.

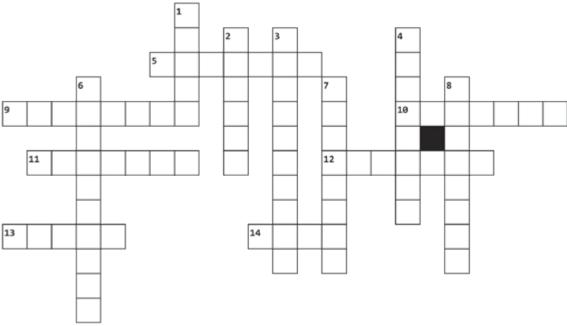

Anxious Attachment Style? Ten Ways to Show up More Secure in Your Romantic Relationships and Ten Ways You Can Help Your Partner to Feel More Secure

Showing up as secure in romantic relationships involves fostering trust, communication, and self-awareness.

- **1. Work on Yourself** Build your self-esteem and confidence. Know your worth and understand that you are deserving of love and respect.
- **2. Communicate Openly** Express your thoughts, feelings, and needs openly and honestly with your partner. Encourage them to do the same.
- **3. Trust** Trust yourself and trust your partner. Trust is the foundation of a healthy relationship. Avoid unnecessary jealousy and possessiveness. Unless they truly show you otherwise, then trust your gut.
- **4. Set Boundaries** Establish clear boundaries and respect each other's boundaries. Boundaries help maintain a sense of safety and autonomy within the relationship.
- **5. Be Supportive** Offer support and encouragement to your partner. Show empathy and understanding towards their experiences and emotions.

City of Calgary - Traffic Update Regarding the Intersection of Canyon Meadows/Parkland

Concerns were raised about the intersection of Canyon Meadows Drive, Parkland Boulevard, and Lake Crimson Drive due to collisions during fall 2024. The Mobility Safety team reviewed collisions and consulted with Calgary Police Service about two left turns across path collisions.

Both investigated collisions were reported to involve red light running, overall collision trends did not indicate unusual patterns.

Traffic counts were reviewed, and the last count was from 2016 so new counts were ordered to be done as soon as possible.

The new count was completed in January 2024 and indicated an increase from 2016.

A new count will be performed fall 2024 while school is in and will cover weekday and weekend conditions.

All traffic counts are publicly available at trafficcounts. calgary.ca.

Based on the review, several improvements were implemented:

- All yellow and red time for signals were reviewed and updated to new standards – reduces likelihood of red light running.
- Leading Pedestrian Interval timing was introduced for pedestrians crossing Canyon Meadows Drive on the east and west side of the intersection. This allows pedestrians a head start to get part way across the intersection before north/south traffic gets a green light.
- •Old backboards around the traffic signal were upgraded to backboards that are larger and have reflective tape around the outside the larger size reduces sun glare, and the reflective tape is noticeable at night to increase the visibility of the traffic signals.
- The damaged pedestrian signal pedestal on the southeast corner of the intersection was replaced.
- Inspections and observations were made before and after with reduced red light running observed.
- A review of protected only left turns (turns only allowed with green arrow not on green ball) was requested.
- The check completed with January count volumes found that protected only left turns for eastbound, northbound, and southbound do not meet national guidelines for installation.
- Traffic volumes would need to increase two to three times such that the protected only left turns would meet those guidelines.
- Implementing protected only left turns that do not meet guidelines will increase delays for all users, including left turning drivers who arrive after the arrow ends and cannot proceed if there is no opposing traffic. Longer wait times can result in poor compliance by people driving, walking, and wheeling, and related safety issues. Instead, we extended the existing westbound arrow that operates part-time (protected permitted where drivers can turn on green arrow and then green ball).

Our Mobility Safety team will continue to monitor this location and review again with the count in fall 2024. Please see our traffic tips at Calgary.ca/trafficsafety.

Alberta Releases Drought Response Plan

I am pleased to share that Alberta's new 2024 Drought Response Plan has been released and will help guide the province through any and all drought conditions. This is a plan covering everything from conservation plans and water-sharing agreements to declaring an emergency and prioritizing water for human health and safety. It will help ensure that Albertans, communities, farmers, ranchers, and businesses get the support they need, whatever the weather.

Drought conditions can change rapidly and impact different areas in very different ways. The Drought Response Plan outlines:

- The five stages of Alberta's drought response.
- The roles and responsibilities of partners, including government, to help everyone collaborate and communicate.
- The regulatory and non-regulatory approaches and tools that may be used in various drought conditions.
- How and when emergencies would be declared, with recognition that declaring an emergency is used as a last resort.

Backyard Play Safety

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) would like to encourage parents and caregivers to ensure their backyard play areas are made safe for children this summer. Although direct supervision is the best method to reduce the chance of injury, always ensure play equipment in your yard is in good repair and is suited to the age and skill of the children using it. Check the equipment often; replace or repair any worn or broken parts. It's also advised to set up play equipment on top of a nine-inch layer of shock-absorbing material which extends six feet out in all directions from the play area.

Water Hazards

- Drowning contributes to unintentional injury-related death among children ages one to four.
- Children can drown in just a few centimetres of water if it covers their mouth and nose.
- Ensure all backyard swimming pools are fenced. The fence must be at least 1.8 metres high and have a self-latching, self-closing, lockable gate (*Alberta Building Code).

Lawn and Garden Tools

- Keep young children away from outdoor power equipment.
- Serious burns may result from touching hot engine surfaces.
- Ensure that all sharp tools, fuel, chemicals, and other hazardous substances are stored in a secure, locked area. A simple latch may not be sufficient.



Insect Bites and Stings

- Minimize the risk of attracting insects by not wearing strong perfumes or scented lotions.
- Avoid wearing brightly coloured clothing outdoors.
- Consider destroying or relocating hives and nests situated near your home.
- To avoid injury through inadvertently stepping on a stinging insect, always wear footwear outdoors.
- If your child has received an 'EpiPen, Junior' prescription from your physician (for anaphylactic reactions only) ensure they understand when and how to use it.
- If your child experiences a severe reaction to an insect sting, or other environmental cause, seek medical attention, or call 911.
