

Hello.

Update on the proposed row house on Queensland Drive. We would like to report that the development that was proposed has been declined. Thank you to the 300 community members who sent in their thoughts as to why this proposal would not fit into our community. Some of the reasons that the proposal was declined were not enough parking for all tenants (there needed to be eight parking spots not only four), the infrastructure needed to be updated to meet the needs to the new property, and the lot coverage exceeded 60%. Please continue to look at the development permits in our area, this will allow us all to be better educated as to what is going into our community and the ones directly around us.

Please help the community with shovelling your sidewalks after snowfall; we have many people walking around our neighbourhood. If you live by a crosswalk, consider moving the snow away from the ramps allowing people to move freely, there are young families using strollers and wagons who need to have those paths cleared to get around the neighbourhood, if you live by a bus stop, please consider helping out the citizens using the bus stops and shovel a bit for them. COOK'S CORNER

Christmas Cookies

Original recipe yields 48 servings.

Ingredients

- 3 ¾ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 ½ cups white sugar
- 1 cup margarine, softened
- 2 large eggs
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract

Directions

- 1. Gather all ingredients.
- 2. Sift flour, baking powder, and salt together in a medium bowl: set aside.
- 3. Beat sugar and margarine in a large bowl with an electric mixer until smooth.
- 4. Beat first egg into butter mixture. Beat second egg into mixture along with vanilla extract; add flour mixture and stir until dough is just combined.
- 5. Wrap dough; chill in the refrigerator for two hours.
- 6. Preheat the oven to 400 degrees Fahrenheit (200 degrees Celsius). Grease two cookie sheets.
- 7. Roll out dough on a clean floured surface to ¼-inch thickness. Cut out shapes using cookie cutters; arrange them on the prepared cookie sheets. Gather scraps and repeat this step.
- 8. Bake in batches in the preheated oven until edges are golden, about 6 to 8 minutes. Cool on the baking sheet briefly before removing to a wire rack to cool completely.
- 9. Serve and enjoy!

SAFE AND SOUND

Cold Weather Safety

by Alberta Health Services

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) paramedics respond to a number of cold weather-related emergencies every winter. However, by taking appropriate measures to dress properly, anticipate sudden weather changes and preparing to be out in the cold, may reduce your risk of sustaining a cold weather illness/injury. It's also advised you store an emergency kit in your vehicle at all times containing extra clothing, blankets and other road-side supplies.

Frostnip


- Frost-nipped skin is extremely cold, but not yet frozen skin:
- It commonly affects the ears, nose, cheeks, fingers and toes;
- The skin may look red and possibly feel numb to the touch;
- When treated promptly, frostnip usually heals without complication;
- Move to a warm environment and immediately, but gently, re-warm the affected area through skin to skin contact (i.e. hand covering tips of ears).

Frostbite

- Frostbite occurs when skin becomes so cold, the skin and underlying tissues freeze;
- Affected skin may look white and waxy and will feel hard to the touch;
- Move to a warm environment immediately and place the affected area in warm, not hot, water until fully re-warmed;
- Call 9-1-1 or seek further medical attention as required.

Hypothermia

- Hypothermia is abnormally low body temperature, less than 34°C (as compared to normal body temperature of about 37°C);
- Early hypothermia may manifest as profound shivering; moderate hypothermic patients may act inappropriately: stumbling, mumbling, and fumbling, as their body temperature continues to drop resulting in severe hypothermia (<30°C);
- Left untreated, severe hypothermia may progress to unconsciousness or death;



- Early recognition and prompt medical attention is key. Call 9-1-1. Don't forget to protect yourself from the factors that originally lead to the patient's situation;
- Initiate gentle re-warming as quickly as possible. Remove any wet or constrictive clothing; cover with blankets or sleeping bags. Protect from further heat loss: eliminate contact with cold surfaces, and shield from wind and moisture.



- 3. Inspect and Clean Gutters: Clear gutters and downspouts of leaves and debris to prevent ice dams that can cause water to back up into your home.
- 4. Prepare Your Pipes: Insulate pipes in unheated areas to prevent freezing and bursting. Turn off water to outdoor faucets and leave them open so they drain.
- 5. Stock Emergency Supplies: Keep an emergency kit ready, including food, water, flashlights, batteries, and a first-aid kit. It's always better to be prepared for power outages or severe weather.

Cedarbrae Fire Station #24 and Seton Fire Station #41, along with the Shepard Landfill, are designated locations for these items.

If you're unsure about where to dispose of a specific item, please check the "What Goes Where" section on the City of Calgary website or call 3-1-1 for assistance.

Building a Brighter Alberta: Progress Update for 2024

To better recruit and retain healthcare professionals, Alberta has introduced a competitive compensation package for resident physicians. As a result, the province had over 12,000 registered doctors by the end of September, a gain of more than 500 compared to last year.

In defense of Alberta's jobs and energy future, the government has launched a national "Scrap the Cap" campaign to raise awareness of the potential impacts of Ottawa's proposed cap on energy production. This campaign encourages Canadians to speak out against this plan and support Alberta's position.


