

Winter 2024 Rink Update

Many in our community might not remember when our outdoor rinks were managed by five or six hearty souls, using a snow blower, shovels, and lots of manual labour, toiling in late night obscurity, battling cold weather, equipment breakdowns, and doing repairs in our tiny, dark and freezing garage.



Times have certainly changed, but the work still remains. Our core "Ice Crew" of 17 volunteers got a good start this winter, with our first official skating day on November 24. Our rinks survived the December warm spell, and we hope to be flooding seven nights a week until spring. Our local volunteers are also working hard on the Adopt-a-Rinks out in our community. If you want to know where they are, go for a walk!

Our Ice crews are always looking for more help. It takes many hours to get our rinks up and running, and most of our volunteers also have busy family lives, volunteering as coaches, referees, or other team helpers during winter. Without more volunteers, other winter community-based outdoor projects like our popular curling and crokicurl rinks will simply not get built.

Our outdoor ice is used constantly, from early morning to late at night. We have Saturday learn to skate lessons, and on any given day you will see hundreds of skaters enjoying the efforts that a handful of volunteers continue to put in.

We run through about \$50 of propane weekly, and our repair and maintenance budget each winter season runs into thousands of dollars as equipment maintenance and repair is constant.

If you enjoyed the rinks in the past and plan to do so again this winter, and want to be part of a feel good WRCA story, what can you do? At least one, hopefully two, and maybe three of the following:

- 1. Buy a WRCA membership.
- 2. Volunteer to help. The commitment is small (around two hours, one night per week) and the reward is immense. If you would like to help on a one-off project like crokicurl or curling, we need you!

- 3. Sign up to buy some rink board advertising! Spaces are limited!
- 4. Consider making a donation to help cover our annual operating costs.

The Willow Ridge Community Association can accommodate a wide range of guests for activities or functions like wedding receptions, birthday parties, baby showers, workshops/seminars, art shows, fitness classes, and more!

Located outside are two private parking lots, crock curl (in the winter), gaga ball pit, pickleball/tennis courts, lacrosse box/hockey rink, baseball diamond, 50-plot community garden, and a large green space which we use for our WRCA Soccer league in the summer and a pleasure skating rink in the winter.

Our newly renovated, air-conditioned building has the following spaces available for rent!

- The Willow 1,924 sq. ft. North Hall (135 dining/200 standing) with large windows, built-in audio/speakers, vaulted ceilings, wood sprung floor. Perfect for high-impact activities!
- The Maple (Closed until fall 2025) 1,200 sq. ft. South Hall (60 dining/135 standing) with large windows, separate sink/washing area, additional storage, vaulted ceilings, and a sound system.
- The Herard Room 540 sq. ft. Board Room (25 dining/50 standing) with large windows, available projector, and mounted whiteboard, conveniently situated off the Ridge Lounge. Perfect for small group yoga, art classes, meetings, catering set-up, etc.

The community centre has the following additional features:

- The Ridge Lounge, an upstairs gathering area for members with a view of the rinks/fields.
- Large floor-to-ceiling windows to allow for more natural light.
- Internal stairs and elevator access to lower level.
- Four individual gender-neutral washrooms, two of which are wheelchair accessible.
- · Wi-Fi throughout building.
- Large change area/washrooms with rubber flooring, accessible to rink users in the winter.

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Civic Affairs RC Update

Hello everyone,

Our list of interested parties compiled from the community information sessions has grown from 58 to 67 in the last week. An email was sent last weekend to confirm contact information and asking for an expression of interest or likelihood of signing into a restrictive covenant for our communities. Thus far, 16 property owners have replied that they are likely to sign such an agreement. The wording of such document will be finalized later, decided by the group. How to develop the communities with secondary suites is the point that still requires discussion.

I have begun working with the same law firm that represent CKE and Lake Bonavista community associations. The plan is to still charge a fee of \$500 for each party with approximately 50% to cover the legal work and title registrations and 50% to go towards a defence fund that is held in a trust. However, what was not mentioned during my first meeting with the lawyers is they are requesting a retainer fee of \$5,000 to begin with our communities. I learned that the retainer fee was also charged to CKE and LB communities.

With 16 property owners indicating that they are likely to participate thus far, we should focus efforts to see if there is more interest in our community restrictive covenant project. We can also consider alternative arrangements to raise additional money so we can get going. If anyone has ideas on how to fund the retainer fee, please contact me directly.

At this stage, I would like to propose that we set up area volunteers to cover different parts of Maple Ridge and Willow Park to share information about the project with neighbours to assess if there is more interest. If you are willing to act as an Area Captain, please let me know and note which area you will cover.

We would like to have another information session at the end of January or the beginning of February and will post the dates when finalized.

The presentation from the information session is available now on our community association web page. Please continue to talk to your neighbours and pass their contact information along to me.


