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CKE Community Garden Update

Winter was slow to arrive this year, but when it did it hit with a vengeance! Regardless of its ferocity, winter brings magic to the garden that is not visible at other times of the year. Once considered good practice to raze our gardens to the ground in the fall keeping things ultra neat and tidy, the current trend is towards a more relaxed approach that favours visual interest and aesthetic appeal.

The easiest way to create interest in winter is by using evergreen trees and shrubs. Needle and cone bearing plants such as pines, spruce, junipers, and fir keep their foliage all winter long, in a variety of textures and colours. With or without snow delicately frosting their branches, they help to make up for the lack of other plant material. Woody plants that lose their leaves still provide interesting structure, and in some cases – like dogwoods – colourful bark that stands out against winter white and shoulder-season drabness. Evergreen perennials including grasses such as blue fescue and blue oat grass, and flowering plants like Bergenia may be covered by a blanket of snow at times, but as it melts, they are revealed to showcase foliage in full colour.

Perennials that die to the ground each year, may still have structure that can withstand winter weather. Grasses like Karl Foerster feather reed grass stand strong against wind and snow. Echinacea and yarrow collect snow on their seed heads, while architectural plants like Russian sage and Joe Pye weed add vertical interest.

Besides providing visual relief in a long Calgary winter, leaving plant material standing provides valuable habitat and food for local wildlife species. Now is a great time to look around your neighbourhood for inspiration and ideas from gardens that appear as good in the winter as they do through the growing season. Stay tuned for new workshops and tours organized by the Community Garden this season!

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Crustless Spinach Quiche

If you are looking for a fast-to-make dinner or brunch dish, this recipe is for you! It takes five minutes to prepare and can be made in one bowl!

Ingredients:

- 1 package frozen chopped spinach, defrosted
- 500-gram container of cottage cheese (2 cups)
- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup flour (can sub 1 cup gluten free flour or potato starch to make this gluten free)
- 2 cups grated cheese (cheddar, mozzarella or whatever's your favourite!)
- 6 eggs
- ½ tsp of Mrs. Dash or no salt seasoning

Method:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit.
- 2. Spray a 9 x 13 baking dish or pie plate with non-stick cooking spray.
- 3. Mix all ingredients together in a large bowl.
- 4. Pour into prepared baking dish and bake for 45 to 60 minutes until slightly golden brown on top.

What Do I Love About This Crustless Quiche Recipe?

- It is fast to make! Seriously, you can prepare this recipe in five minutes. While it takes 45 minutes to cook, I can be doing something else during that time such as cleaning up the kitchen, organizing, answering emails, etc.
- · You can enjoy this recipe as a quiche or cook this recipe in muffin tins for quiche-muffins, which are great for packing lunches, as well as grab and go meals and snacks.
- You can prepare this quiche and freeze it.
- You can substitute other cooked vegetables in place for the spinach.
- This recipe works for dinner, but also would be an excellent breakfast, brunch, or lunch.



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City Zoning Changes

Many of you have read or otherwise heard about the City's contemplated change to zoning whereby all residential areas of Calgary would be re-zoned on a blanket basis to R-CG zoning. The City's Council will hold a Public Hearing on the proposal on April 22 (stay tuned for more details).

If implemented across Calgary, this change to zoning means that row-houses, townhouses, multi-unit residences, single detached or semi-detached buildings could be built in CKE without you, your neighbours or our Community Association having any say, as long as the development were compliant with other City requirements respecting such matters as setbacks and height.

This would allow for a much greater level of densification on individual lots in CKE than contemplated in the Heritage Local Area Plan that was approved by the City in 2023. Under the Heritage Local Area Plan, the most typical contemplated level of densification within CKE allowed for two-unit development, with the possibility of secondary suites. The R-CG re-zoning, on the other hand, could easily allow eight units on the typical 50b lot, for which two units and two secondary suites may have been permitted under the Heritage Local Area Plan, with higher density permitted on larger lots. This potential rezoning could have a significant potential impact on CKE, so the CKE Community Association Board will be seeking feedback from residents in the near future in order to finalize our position on this proposal.


