Apple Trees in Calgary

Crabapple trees are in abundance in Calgary, but true apple trees tend to be less common. Both are in the same genus and are very closely related and similar. What differentiates the two is the size of the fruit. A crabapple has fruit that is 2" (5cm) or less in diameter.

There are several types of apple trees that can be very successful in Calgary including Norland, Prairie Sensation, Goodland, Alberta Gold, and Alberta Red. Carlos Queen, Annas Gold, and Norkent may be less popular but are also available from specialty fruit tree suppliers like DNA Gardens.

Most apple trees grown in Calgary will reach 15 to 20 feet (4.5 to 6 metres) in height and width, but in some cases can be available as dwarf selections. These are grafted onto dwarf root stock and will reach only half of this size – a great option for a smaller garden. In the CKE Community Garden, we have a TreasuRed, planted a few years ago. This is columnar in shape, staying fairly narrow. It will reach approximately 15 feet (4.5m) in height but only 3 to 4 feet (1 to 1.5m) in width. It's also possible to plant a combination apple tree, which can have several different types of apples grafted onto a single trunk. Apples can be grown for eating, cooking, and storing so select a variety that suits your needs.

When choosing a location in your yard, make sure you have space to accommodate the tree's mature size. Apple trees need full sun (minimum six hours per day), well-draining soil and will benefit from a layer of mulch around the base to help with winter hardiness. All apple trees need to be crosspollinated by an apple of a different variety, or even by a crabapple. The two plants do not need to be located next to each other. They could be in the same yard, or even in a neighbour's yard several houses away.

Apples can be ready for picking as early as late July all the way through September depending on the cultivar so take a look and see what apples might be ripening in your area. You can check out TreasuRed apple tree and other fruit trees and shrubs in the CKE Community Garden.

Let's Keep Our Kids Safe as They Head Back to School

As we gear up for the school year, we are asking people who drive to prioritize the safety of our students, and remember these safety tips:

- The kids are counting on us. Slow down and look out for them, especially in playground zones and around schools. It takes less than a minute to travel through most playground zones and speeding typically only "saves" a driver ten seconds. Be safe and slow down.
- Watch the crosswalks. Stopping or parking too close to a crosswalk creates dangerous conditions for pedestrians. People crossing the street cannot see past a car that is parked too close and approaching drivers cannot see pedestrians. Stopping too close to a crosswalk, even for just a minute, is too long. Be safe and watch out—please do not block crosswalks.
- Double parking creates unsafe conditions. Double parking is when a vehicle stops or parks in the roadway alongside another already parked car. Double parked vehicles not only obstruct the flow of traffic but can block the view of other drivers, making it difficult to see pedestrians or other vehicles. Encouraging passengers to get out of the car when double parked puts them in harm's way. When you choose to double park, even just for a minute, our kids are at risk of getting hurt. Be safe, park smart!

When driving, please choose safety over convenience—the kids are counting on us.



118 Cub Scouts Pizza Calzones

Ingredients:

- 1 pre-made refrigerated pizza crust (the kind in the can works awesomely)
- ½ cup marinara sauce, chose your favourite kind (or you can get pizza sauce)
- 1 cup shredded mozzarella cheese
- 16 slices of pepperoni (more if you like a lot of pepperonis)
- · Butter for greasing your pie irons

Any other pizza fillings you'd like. Our Cubs loved chopped up meatballs

Directions:

- 1. Prep Your Fire and Pie Irons
- Usually when cooking on a campfire, you don't want to put your pots, pans, or pie irons directly into the flames because it's too hot. Let your fire burn for a bit before cooking so the logs are glowing, and the flames are low.
- If you're doing all of your prep work at your campfire, you can let the fire burn while you do your prep work below. Please do not leave fires unattended.
- Pie irons need to be hot before you place your calzones in them. They do not take long to heat up, when your prep work is complete, places the pie irons in the fire for about five minutes. When you take them out be careful to only place them on heat safe surfaces! Use plenty of butter all over the insides.
- 2. Prepare Your Dough
- If you opt for the prepared pizza crust all you have to do to prepare the crust is to lay it out flat and cut

it into squares. You'll need a top and a bottom piece of crust for each pizza pocket. Cubs like to place the butter on the pie iron then bottom dough in the hot pie iron then fill (bonus: try using garlic butter).

- 3. Layer Up the Fillings
- Sprinkle a little mozzarella cheese on each dough, then add about 2 tbsp of marinara sauce. Layer up the pepperoni and add any other toppings you like (Cubs usually like cheese pizza or pepperoni). Then top with a bit more mozzarella. Be careful not to overfill.
- Finally, Take the Other Crust Square and Place It on Top of the Fillings
- Using a fork gently push down the edges on all four sides to seal those fillings inside the crust. Do this gently or you'll force the toppings out of the sides. The pie iron is hot so it might be best to have an adult do this part.
- 5. Cook for approximately 3 minutes, then flip. Cook for another 3 to 5 minutes (checking for doneness at the 2-minute mark). You'll know they're done when you see a delicious golden-brown crust.
- 6. When done, remove them from the pie irons and flip them onto a plate or cutting board. They'll be hot so be very careful! If you like any dressing or such, drizzle that on too.


