

Update on QuadReal's Application to Change the ARP and DC

On July 25, ECCA received applications from QuadReal to amend the Area Redevelopment Plan (ARP) and Direct Control District (DC). These were scheduled for the Calgary Planning Commission (CPC) meeting on August 7. Thanks to Ward 7 Councillor Terry Wong, an all-stakeholders meeting was held on July 30, giving us the chance to address concerns directly with City representatives and the developer.

Key Wins

ECCA successfully:

- Stopped the addition of "with the option for commercial uses throughout the majority of the development" to the ARP.
- \bullet Kept ARP clauses 4.4 and 6.1.3, which cap commercial use at 9,000 m 2 .
- Added language to the updated 2025 paragraph specifying the development will be "primarily residential" and will "transition from highest densities closest to the core and step down to lower densities adjacent to the river."
- Removed vague phrases like "8.0 FAR with bonusing" and "across the entire site," replacing them with clear FARs for each site that include all bonusing provisions.
- Removed "mixed-use" from the DC Purpose.
- Removed the following discretionary uses from the CC-X template:
 - Beverage Container Quick Drop Facility (bottle depot)
 - · Cannabis Store
 - · General Industrial Light
 - Pawn Shop
 - · Payday Loan
- Retained the existing limit of 10% commercial frontage along Eau Claire Avenue.
- Ensured the sunlight protection area explicitly includes the promenade.

What We Couldn't Change

- Re-introducing a minimum unit size in section 5.4.1 to prevent extremely small condos.
- Adding more restrictive language to ARP 5.1.3.

- Removing the discretionary uses:
 - · Liquor Store
 - Night Club
 - City officials assured us size restrictions would limit these to boutique wine/whiskey shops or small venues (e.g., a jazz club), and only along 2 Avenue.

Other Discussions

5 Street Easement and Setbacks: The City confirmed the Easement agreement takes precedence over both the ARP and DC. 5 Street will remain a two-way street with vehicle, bicycle, and pedestrian access.

Next Steps

We've updated our CPC response letter to reflect both our wins and ongoing concerns. While we didn't achieve every goal, these outcomes were possible because residents spoke up and our team came prepared.

At the August 7 CPC meeting, some commissioners questioned whether our discretionary use wins were too restrictive but ultimately left them unchanged.

Thank you to everyone who participated—your involvement made a real difference.

4 Avenue Development Update

ECCA is excited about the increased residential development along 4 Avenue SW.

Kings on Fourth will include 120 residential units along with office space and a hotel in a luxury mixed-use tower development.

Directly to the north on 3 Avenue are the two office-to-residential conversions, which together will add 282 residential units this year.

At the corner of 4 Avenue and 7 Street is The Loft, which is also scheduled to open in 2025 and add another 56 homes in our neighbourhood.

Trico Homes is joining in with a proposed new residential development with commercial at-grade right beside The Loft. This is very preliminary; they are looking for a land use amendment right now, but we are excited at the prospect of more residential development in our neighbourhood.

Just across 4 Avenue, Cantiro is scheduled to add 340 residential units by 2028 and Cidex will complete another 234 in the same year.

We had an amazing time at Café con Dos Leches in August—a free, inclusive celebration that brought our community together through music, dancing, and connection. Inspired by Dos Leches' mission to activate public spaces and create welcoming events for all, the afternoon was filled with dancing, picnics, and laughter.

Alcohol in Parks Program at Peace Park

Adults can enjoy responsible alcohol consumption in a designated area of Peace Park (311 8 St SW, near River Hall) from 11:00 am to 9:00 pm daily. Look for onsite signs to confirm the permitted area, alcohol is prohibited outside these boundaries.

Program Background

Launched as a pilot in 2021, the Alcohol in Parks program has been popular, with over 1,500 bookings in its first season. Surveys show 65% of Calgarians support it, 96% found it a great alternative to being indoors, and 73% said it increased their park visits.

Key Rules

- Drink in moderation and follow Canada's low risk drinking guidelines.
- Public intoxication, disruptive behaviour, and public urination are not tolerated.
- No alcohol outside designated areas.
- Remove all garbage and empty containers before leaving.

Special Events

When a festival or event is taking place at Peace Park, alcohol can only be purchased from licensed vendors; outside alcohol is not allowed.

Why Peace Park?

This location serves a high-density neighbourhood where many residents don't have private outdoor space to gather with friends and family.

Report Issues

If someone isn't following the rules, call the nonemergency line at 403-266-1234. For urgent situations, call 9-1-1.




