GLENBROOK COMMUNITY CLEANUP

Hey Glenbrook! Each year, City of Calgary Waste & Recycling Services and Community Strategies partner with community associations to help Calgarians get rid of unwanted household items and property waste.

This event saves residents a trip to the landfill for items that do not fit in their waste carts - or for those who do not have cart service at their address - by providing multiple packer trucks and crews for waste. This service is free for all Calgarians.

Community volunteers will be on hand to assist with unloading items from vehicles. One vehicle load per household. No charitable exchanges.

The following items MAY NOT be brought to the cleanup site:

- Tires

- Home Appliances
- Paint

- Household Chemicals
- Propane Tanks
- Microwaves

- Car Batteries
- Railroad Tires

- Glass

- Liquids

Household items and clothing will be collected by Women In Need Society (WINS), and Eligible Program Electronics by Technotrash.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Hello Glenbrook!

May is a great month for beautifying our community after a long winter. On Saturday, May 3, we will be hosting our Parks Cleanup event, where we will spruce up local parks, streets, and public spaces. If you are interested in participating, more details can be found in this newsletter.

We will also be having our annual Community Cleanup, a.k.a. Dumpster Day, on Saturday, May 31 in partnership with the City of Calgary. A full list of goods that can and cannot be accepted is included in the newsletter as well. Women In Need Society (WINS) will be onsite to accept donations of gently used household items and clothing. Technotrash will also be on hand to collect Eligible Program Electronics, including televisions, monitors, laptops and other computers, printers and fax machines, as well as batteries from small appliances and other devices. For every tonne of electronic waste collected, the community association will receive a funding rate of \$500.

Now that spring has sprung, we are planning a number of other fun community events for the near future. The Glenbrook Greenthumbs Community Garden will have an herb container workshop on Monday, May 5, led by Janet Melrose from Calgary's Cottage Gardener. Registration is required as limited spots are available.

We will be hosting Confidently You, a workshop in partnership with the Queen's Confidence Academy, on Thursday, May 22. Kids can learn from Calgary Pageant winners about building confidence in themselves and uplifting others through hands-on activities and discussions. Registration is required, and more information can be found inside the newsletter.

We are continuing to accept nominations for our two annual community awards, but the deadline is fast approaching. If you would like more information on the Glenbrook Lifetime Member Award or the Glenbrook Community Partnership Award, please reach out to us before Monday, May 20, and we will help you through the nomination process.

Finally, May is National Bike Month! If you're ever in need of a reason to dust off your bike, May might just be the perfect time to get out and explore the city. It's also a great reminder to be aware that cyclists and motorcyclists are back out on the road. As always, please

Butterfly Garden



The beautiful Mourning Cloak is one of the first butterflies to delight us in the spring. It gets a head start by overwintering here as an adult, in tree cavities or under loose bark. When it emerges in early spring, it feeds on tree sap from woodpecker or flicker holes. It is not a pollinator, preferring trees like aspen or willow which are hosts for the larvae.

We can help increase the wildlife in Glenbrook by focusing on pollinator gardens to attract butterflies, bees, and other insects. These can be additions to your existing gardens or the creation of new ones. The more we plant, the more butterflies we will see and the sooner we will reap the benefits.

Let's start by beautifying our community meeting place, with a butterfly garden at the front corner of the community hall. We will be hosting a plant exchange of pollinator-friendly perennials on Saturday, May 10 at 10:00 am at the Glenbrook Greenthumbs Garden, and then bringing them to the hall to plant. We will focus on native, drought-tolerant species such as Asclepias (butterfly weed) and Penstemon (beardtongues).




