

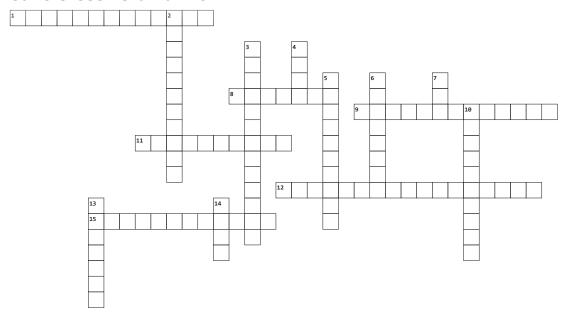








## **June Crossword Puzzle**

### **SAFETY CORNER**



#### Impaired Driving

Impaired driving is a tricky subject and can encompass many aspects, not just impairment by drug or alcohol. Impairment can include sleep, fatigue, medical, or distraction.

Impairment starts at just having one alcoholic drink, as it affects perception, reaction, judgement, and narrows vision. However, for impairment, the province and federal laws must attach a number for charging. Studies have shown that a person's diving is impaired at 80 mg of alcohol in 100 ml of blood.

Impairment is different from drunk; being drunk is the gross extreme of impairment. Signs of impairment can include glassy, blood shot eyes, a smell of liquor from breath, exaggerated motor skills, and slurred speech.

In Alberta, we have the Mandatory Alcohol Screening, or MAS. This program allows police, on a lawful traffic stop, to demand that the driver submit to a roadside breath test without suspicion or admittance of alcohol consumption. It is illegal to refuse the test.

There are different license suspensions, vehicle seizure times, and fines dependent on previous Immediate Roadside Sanctions, IRS WARN Program. The program was developed for several reasons and is not used in place of criminal charges where injury or loss of life occurs.

With the legalization of cannabis, signs of impairment can still be present and different physical testing is done for drugs.

## Calgary's Heritage Trees

Calgary is a city that is known for its natural beauty, and one of the most impressive features is the city's heritage trees. In the 1890s, at the beginning of Calgary's greatest economic boom, William



Pearce, a Canadian government surveyor, was passionate about trees. He thought Calgary should be covered with trees and he developed an experimental farm testing a variety of trees to encourage Calgarians to plant trees around their homes.

That was the beginning of the heritage trees we now enjoy. These trees are considered to be of significant importance due to their age, size, and historical significance. In Calgary, heritage trees are protected by City bylaws, which help to ensure that they are preserved for future generations to enjoy. Look for the plaques that identify heritage trees.

Calgary's oldest elm tree is in Victoria Park and is known as the 'Stampede Elm.' Although designated as a heritage tree, no one knows how old it really is, though it's estimated to be about 125 years old and is known to have existed before the first Stampede in 1912!

Another notable heritage tree in Calgary is the 100-yearold Siberian elm tree in Mount Pleasant. This tree is over 20 metres tall with a circumference of three metres. It is beloved by the neighbourhood for its beauty and history.



Calgary's heritage trees are not just impressive because of their size and age, but they also serve an important ecological function. Trees help to purify the air, provide shade, and regulate the temperature of the environment, to say nothing of the carbon they sequester. They are also essential habitats for many different species of birds and insects.

Calgary has used trees to memorialize Calgarians killed in battle during WWI and II along Memorial Drive.

By preserving these heritage trees, we are not only protecting our city's history and beauty, but also helping to maintain the health and balance of our local ecosystems.

Calgary is situated on Treaty 7 grasslands that had virtually no trees, except for the cottonwoods in the river valleys for millennia, and has gone from that to having approximately 7 million private and public trees that have an estimated value of \$1.23 billion since the 1890s. 


Emmy and Huey's favourite pastime is watching the squirrels run up and down the tree. And birds, did we mention birds! Wow there's a lot in the neighbourhood!

#### Friends,

Congratulations to all those who are graduating and 'crossing the stage' this spring. Take the time to share this moment with your family and friends and marvel at all your achievements. This is a life event we all need to celebrate together with those that are important to each of us.

Canada Day is approaching, and I will be celebrating at events around the riding. If our paths don't cross during the celebrations, please accept my warm wishes. We live in a great country and taking the day to remember what Canada means to the world is a tribute to everyone who has helped build this nation. This Canada Day will be filled with many celebrations as Canadians celebrate our democracy, peace, prosperity, and diversity. However, this year also marks a grim milestone in our nation's history – the 100th Anniversary of the Chinese Exclusion Act.

On July 1, 1923, the Federal Government essentially ended all immigration from China for 25 years. This was the only time in our history, the government banned entry into Canada based upon country of origin. This separated many families as many husbands and fathers were already living in Canada, while at the same time their wives and children were not permitted to immigrate. These men were here to work on the railroad and to build the critical infrastructure that we depend upon today. Unemployed and retired Chinese men were encouraged to return to China. This Act decimated many Canadian Chinese communities.

Those Chinese Canadians that remained in Canada were forced by the government to register and carry an immigration card. The card stated: "This Certificate does not establish legal status in Canada." This embarrassment has led many Chinese Canadians to refer to Canada Day as "Humiliation Day."

There is not a single country with a perfect history. Yet Canada remains a beacon of hope for many. Anyone can build a future in Canada regardless of their ethnicity, sex, religion, or background. It is important to remember all our history – good and bad. These are the building blocks of a better country, for which we all strive.

## **Backyard Play Safety**

from Alberta Health Services

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) would like to encourage parents and caregivers to ensure their backyard play areas are made safe for children this summer. Although direct supervision is the best method to reduce the chance of injury, always ensure play equipment in your yard is in good repair and is suited to the age and skill of the children using it. Check the equipment often; replace or repair any worn or broken parts. It's also advised to set up play equipment on top of a nine-inch layer of shock-absorbing material which extends six feet out in all directions from the play area.

#### Water Hazards

- Drowning contributes to unintentional injury-related death among children ages one to four
- Children can drown in just a few centimetres of water if it covers their mouth and nose
- Ensure all backyard swimming pools are fenced. The fence must be at least 1.8 metres high and have a self-latching, self-closing, lockable gate. (\*Alberta Building Code)

#### **Lawn and Garden Tools**

- Keep young children away from outdoor power equipment
- Serious burns may result from touching hot engine surfaces
- Ensure that all sharp tools, fuel, chemicals, and other hazardous substances are stored in a secure, locked area.
  A simple latch may not be sufficient.

#### **Insect Bites and Stings**

- Minimize the risk of attracting insects by not wearing strong perfumes or scented lotions
- · Avoid wearing brightly coloured clothing outdoors
- Consider destroying or relocating hives and nests situated near your home
- •To avoid injury through inadvertently stepping on a stinging insect, always wear footwear outdoors
- If your child has received an 'EpiPen, Junior' prescription from your physician (for anaphylactic reactions only) ensure they understand when and how to use it
- If your child experiences a severe reaction to an insect sting, or other environmental cause, seek medical attention, or call 911.
