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Support Victoria Fortuna and Her Family After a Tragic Highway Accident



In the early evening of February 8, 2026, the Fortuna family's life was forever altered by a devastating and senseless accident.

Victoria, a 21-year-old student at MacEwan University, and her father, Paul Fortuna, 53 years old, were the innocent victims of a horrific and tragic vehicle accident that occurred in Edmonton, Alberta. Sadly, her father, Paul, succumbed to his injuries at the scene, and Victoria has been left with catastrophic, life-threatening, and life-altering injuries. She is currently fighting for her life and receiving critical medical care at the University Hospital in Edmonton.

This GoFundMe, created in partnership with her family, is being established to help ease the inconceivable financial hardship they are facing.

The initial \$100,000 fundraising target will help cover immediate expenses, including lodging in Edmonton for Victoria's mother, Colleen (Cousens) Fortuna, and 16-year-old sister, Ariana, both from Calgary. This will also allow Colleen to take necessary time away from work during this period of immense hardship and profound change to focus on Victoria's medical journey and to help her daughters through the unimaginable grief of the sudden, tragic loss of their father.

In the days, months, and years ahead, Victoria will require additional surgeries, extensive rehabilitation, specialized leg prosthetics, intensive mental health support, and enduring general medical care. The financial impact will be significant and ongoing, with future fundraising goals evolving as a result of these needs.

The family is deeply grateful for the kindness, prayers, and support they have already received. Your generosity, through a donation or by sharing this GoFundMe, will allow them to focus on supporting their beloved Victoria through her long recovery journey. It takes a village and every donation counts.

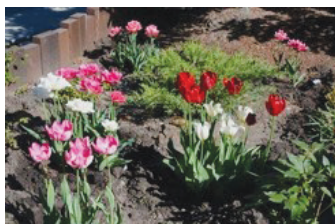

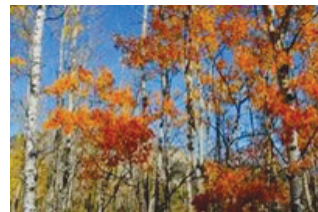
Each summer we host a "Blanc en Blanc" party. Everyone is required to wear all white, including shoes...men and women! And so, I decided to see if I

As October approaches, we're ready for a delightful

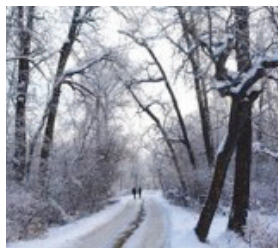
slowdown. Enjoying the fall colors, a lot less watering, more dinner parties for friends now that we have more time, and the amazing change of seasons.

Falls are the leading cause of injury-related hospitalizations for Canadians aged 65 and older.

Fall-Proofing the Home for Autumn and Winter

As autumn settles in and winter approaches, wet leaves, rain, snow, ice, and earlier darkness can make everyday spaces more slippery—especially for older adults. Even a small slip can lead to serious injury with longer hospital stays, loss of confidence, and reduced independence. The good news is that many falls can be prevented.

1. Brighten Walkways and Rooms

- Replace dim bulbs right away.
- Add nightlights in halls, bathrooms, and bedrooms.
- Keep paths clear of shoes, cords, and clutter.

2. Reduce Trip Hazards Underfoot

- Secure or remove rugs to prevent trips.
- Use sturdy heavy mats inside and outside entrances.
- Wear non-slip footwear instead of socks.

3. Make Wet Areas Safer

- Use non-slip mats in tubs and wet areas.
- Install grab bars near toilets and showers.
- Wipe spills as soon as they happen.
- Store heavy items within easy reach.

4. Prepare for Snow, Ice, and Leaves

- Place ice-melt, a scoop, and gloves near the main entrance.
- Test outdoor lights and replace weak bulbs.
- Move boots, mats, and umbrellas away from walking paths.
- Sweep wet leaves from steps and walkways.
- Check railings before snow and ice arrive.
- Push snow rather than lifting when possible.
- Take breaks and stay hydrated while shoveling.
- Ask for help with heavy shoveling or icy steps when needed.

Small changes made now can prevent serious falls later.

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Ballet Season

In 1841, Paris, France premiered Giselle, for the first time. The Romance Era ballet featured a young peasant girl falling in love with noble man in disguise. This delightfully entertaining ballet became increasingly popular for its spooky themes and ghostly motifs.



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Alberta voters face a deeply consequential referendum on October 19.

The ballot has 10 questions covering issues ranging from immigration and voting requirements, to constitutional reform and Alberta's relationship with Canada.

The referendum is going to be a costly initiative with ballooning administration due to requirements for hand-counting ballots and recruiting 60,000 workers. It's estimated to cost between \$90 and \$130 million.

We know that a large majority of Albertans are strongly in favour of Alberta remaining in Canada, but voter turnout for referenda is historically quite a bit lower than during general elections. We have to reverse that trend on October 19.

I'm sure you've seen the street signs popping up all over Calgary-Currie; No to the Nine. Forever Canadian. Let Alberta Decide. For Alberta, For Canada. These are all various campaigns endorsing various positions on the 10 referendum questions.

It's important that you know where your elected representative sits on the issues. I have been unequivocal in my support for Alberta to remain in Canada.

I've also already ordered my mail-in ballot from Elections Alberta and am encouraging everyone to do the same. It takes just a few minutes to head over to elections.ab.ca or call 1-877-422-8683 to make the request. This way, you can take some time to review the questions carefully, consult credible sources and make your own informed decisions before mailing them back in the enclosed postage-paid envelope.

If you prefer to vote in-person, advance voting polls will be open from October 13 to 17. Go to elections.ab.ca to find those locations when they are announced.

On October 19, voting locations will be open from 9:00 am to 8:00 pm and electors must vote at their assigned voting location in their electoral division. You can find this information at elections.ab.ca.

Most importantly, don't sit this one out.
