Rare Plants in Alberta – Green Milkweed and Sticky Purple Geranium

Thursday, February 22, 2024, 7:00 to 8:30 pm.

Presented by Tory Blanchard, Masters of Ecology Student – University of Calgary.

Conservation needs a greater focus on how rare species interact within their neighbourhoods. Rare plants have been found to exist in areas that are positively associated. These are areas with plant communities that facilitate or help one another. One example of facilitation occurs through shared pollinators. Common plants may attract numerous pollinating species, such as bees and butterflies, to a community and the rare plants who rely on these pollinators for their reproduction will benefit indirectly from the common plants. Tory's work will examine the distribution, assembly, and pollinator-mediated plant interactions of two rare species in southern Alberta: Green Comet Milkweed and Sticky Purple Geranium. The study will involve collaboration with members of the Kainai First Nation and will use data from community science platforms such as iNaturalist to address these occurrences. 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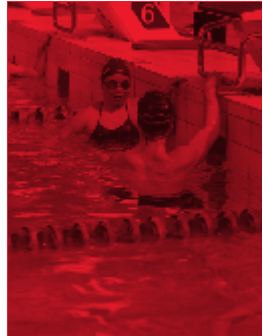
