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

The band, based in Calgary, has been performing their brand of cool, funky jazz across Alberta for the past 19 years.

Blues and Latin elements are strong components of the group's sound, as they take jazz standards and perform them with their own unique twist!

Recent performances include the Cliff Bungalow-Mission Jazz Series, Canadian Jazz YYC Festival, National Music Centre, Arts Commons, Alvin's Jazz Club, and numerous other jazz clubs, nightclubs, hotels, along with a multitude of corporate events.

The players are:

Rick Climans on saxophones. Rick is a life-long saxophonist and teaching artist in Toronto. Rick has played in diverse genres from jazz to rhythm and blues, and from pop/rock to synth wave. Jazz is definitely his prime focus and special area of expertise. He's performed across North America, including New Orleans, San Francisco, Santa Barbara, Phoenix, and Toronto.

Morgan McKee on keyboards. Morgan has a strong musical pedigree having graduated from the iconic Berklee College of Music in Boston, and is a highly sought after keyboard player, who has performed across the United States and Canada. He is also actively directing and performing in numerous theatrical productions across Alberta.

Stefano Valdo on bass. After musical education in his native Italy, Stefano moved to California, immersing himself in the Los Angeles performing scene. After moving to Calgary in 2006, Stefano has been an active player and instructor, along with being an adjunct professor of music at Ambrose University.

Robin Tufts on drums. Robin is one of the most highly regarded drummers in Calgary. His musical approach to percussion and his versatility lends itself to any style of music, especially jazz. Besides being the primary drummer in Rick's Quartet, he performs with a huge array of artists, both vocalists and dance companies, including the University of Calgary.

The Community Gardens

Of course, the big story of the summer was water restrictions, which our amazing garden managers, Natasha Kuzmak (Cliff Bungalow) and Georgina Jameson (Mission), handled with aplomb.

An issue Natasha and her gardeners faced this year, more than ever before, was the theft of vegetables. A couple of the gardeners were heartbroken to arrive and find full gown zucchinis and tomatoes had disappeared overnight. Unfortunately, this is a constant challenge for the Cliff Bungalow Garden, which isn't fenced.

As always, both gardens have a waiting list so if you'd like a plot, please email me ASAP to get on the list.

More Trees

We planted three new fruit trees in the greenspaces around the community centre/Montessori school on Cliff Street and are crossing our fingers that the limited watering they got due to the water restrictions won't affect their ability to live through a challenging Calgary winter.

The Environment committee has met with the folks at the city's Urban Forestry department to implement a plan for CBMCA to take a bigger role in planning where new trees will be planted in coming years. We will be very pleased to have input into a proactive planting plan more conducive to Cliff Bungalow-Mission's particular climate, which can be very different from suburban communities.

Triangle Park

We are working with the Parks department to adopt Triangle Park, situated at the intersection of 24 Avenue and Cliff Street. A greenspace agreement will allow us to improve the park with perennial beds and other plantings.

We got started this year by pruning overgrown bushes and planting hostas, rudbeckia, and lilacs. Of course, we'll be leaning to drought-tolerant and native plants whenever possible.

Development Pressures Altering Community Character

We are experiencing a time of extreme development pressure in Cliff Bungalow-Mission. And with the imminent passage of the West Elbow Local Area Plan, the City will be upzoning areas of our community to accommodate even greater density. With new developments we too often lose our heritage buildings, and with them the character that makes this community so special. And, as residents in the southern blocks of Cliff Bungalow can attest, few things can change your quality of life so dramatically as having a tower constructed next door.

101-109 17 Avenue SW (Economy Glass Site)

A developer is applying for a land use redesignation to allow for a mixed-use project with ground floor retail and residential units above. This will likely involve a tower, but if their application is approved, we likely won't see building details until some point next year. This is in a zone identified by the City of Calgary in the new draft Local Area Plan to accommodate buildings of up to 26 storeys.

121 17 Avenue SE

A block east on 17 Avenue a land use redesignation has been submitted to the City to enable a six-storey multi-residential development with retail at grade. This looks to be a case of "sensitive densification" that would be a good fit for our community, filling in a relatively underutilized lot and helping to improve the 17 Avenue streetscape as you approach Macleod Trail.

101 25 Avenue SW

There is a plan to redevelop the site of the Shorecrest Manor apartment building at the far eastern edge of Mission along 25 Avenue right before crossing over the bridge to Erlton. This is a difficult site due to the lack of a back alley and its proximity to the river. We'll report more details of this project as details become available.

615 17 Avenue SW

The strip mall, residential bungalows, and a small apartment building immediately east of Western Canada High School have now been razed to make way for the 16-storey Francesco's mixed-use project. This project was not supported by the CBMCA, but the writing was on the wall when the City of Calgary rezoned the property to allow for a building of that scale.




1905 5 Street SW



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
