# **Redevelopment Pressures Continue to Mount**

The goal of the CBMCA's Planning and Development Committee is to protect and enhance the character of the built environment in Cliff Bungalow-Mission by engaging with developers, property owners, and the City of Calgary to advocate for our community's built form, heritage, and overall livability. It also engages with City planners regarding planning legislation affecting the area, such as the soon-to-be-law West Elbow Local Area Plan.

2024 was a busy year for our volunteer committee. We worked with developers and property owners to achieve the best results possible for Cliff Bungalow-Mission, but our vision for the community is increasingly undermined by the City of Calgary's record of approving every application to upzone properties and build inappropriately oversized projects. We continue the fight to preserve the special character of the Mission District, but the losses are mounting, the heritage homes continue to fall, and the redevelopment pressures are growing.

### Some Current Projects Rezoning of Property – 608 22 Ave SW

An application to rezone the property at 608 22 Ave SW from M-CGd72 to M-C2 was approved by the City in early February. This will allow the applicant to demolish the heritage home on that lot, along with the small apartment building they own next door, in order to develop a five-storey apartment building on the combined site. We opposed this application and representatives of the CBMCA spoke against it at a public hearing of City Council.

### Repositioning of Existing House and Construction of an Adjoining Home – 601 22 Ave SW

In one of the wackiest applications any of us have ever seen, this proposal would take the existing house on the southwest corner of 5 Street and 22 Avenue, turn it 90 degrees clockwise (so it would then be facing 5th), and then construct a new addition onto the north side of the existing house. The CBMCA opposed the applications to allow for this strange development, citing its negative impact on neighbouring properties and concerns about contextual setbacks, excess height, and failing to respect the scale and architecture of the existing heritage homes on this block within Cliff Bungalow's historical conservation area. The City approved the application and the CBMCA will decide at a future meeting whether to appeal that decision.

### Demolition of Heritage House and Construction of New Duplex – 1925 5A St SW

The CBMCA opposed this application due to the loss of a 'century home' on a very important and largely intact heritage streetscape as well as a design for the new building that did not "respect the historic style of homes in Cliff Bungalow or incorporate elements of the original building styles common to the community." The City approved this project and the CBMCA filed a notice to appeal that approval. The developer, hoping to avoid an appeal, has indicated that they will come back with revised plans prior to the appeal date.

# **Burns and Scalds**

### by Alberta Health Services

Each year Emergency Medical Services respond to emergencies involving young children who have sustained severe burns or scalds. These incidents often occur inside the child's own home. Common causes include a child accidentally tipping hot liquids onto themselves, touching hot surfaces such as stoves, or making contact with electrical outlets. Fortunately, incidents such as these can be avoided by taking preventative measures.

### **Degrees of Burn**


- 1°: Affects only the top layers of the skin; appears red like a sun burn; discomfort is generally tolerable.
- 2°: Deeper and much more painful than 1° burns; broken skin or blisters commonly develop.
- 3°: Severe. The deepest layers of skin and tissue are injured; may appear charred or leathery.

### **First Aid for Burns**

- Skin may continue to burn if not cooled. Immediately douse burns with large amounts of cold water.
- Cover the burn with a sterile dressing, or at least clean material to protect infection.
- Over-the-counter medications may be used for pain. Adhere to directions given on the label.
- Seek further medical attention, as required.

### **Prevention of Burns**

• Check the temperature of your hot water tank. Temperatures as high as 60°C / 140°F will scald a child in just seconds.



- Use placemats instead of tablecloths. Tablecloths can be yanked downward causing hot drinks or food to spill on a child.
- Turn pot handles to the back of the stove and ensure cords from kettles, slow cookers, and other electrical appliances cannot be reached.
- Avoid picking up a child while holding any hot liquids.
- Ensure electrical outlets are made secure by installing commercially available safety devices which prohibit access.
- Keep children away from areas where appliances are in use (kettles, irons, hot stoves).

If you require immediate medical attention, call 911.

# CBMCA Casino 2025 – We Need Volunteers

Tax season is here and below are some changes that will affect business taxes in 2025.

### Transitioning to online mail for most business correspondence

Beginning in spring 2025, the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) will make online mail the default for most business correspondence, delivering notices, and updates.

### **Changes for short-term rentals**

New legislative changes require short-term rentals to be compliant with the short-term rental laws in the municipality/province in which they are located in order to claim deductions. Short-term rental hosts were required to comply with these applicable provincial and municipal registration, permit, license, and operating requirements by December 31, 2024.

### The CRA is administering proposed capital gains inclusion rate legislation

On January 31, 2025, the Minister of Finance announced that the federal government is deferring -from June 25, 2024 to January 1, 2026—the date on which the capital gains inclusion rate would increase from one-half to two-thirds on capital gains realized annually above \$250,000 by individuals and on all capital gains realized by corporations and most types of trusts. The capital gains inclusion rate represents the portion of capital gains that is taxable.
