We are now collecting ideas and welcome any input from our community residents. We will report back on our progress in future newsletters.

Fall Candle Care: How to Prevent Tunneling

Fall is a popular time for candlelight and cozy nights in, which means dusting off your candle collection. You might notice that some have developed a deep "tunnel" around the wick, making it difficult to light. Tunneling also shortens the life of your candle as only the wax in the centre of the candle will burn down.

Here are a few easy ways to prevent or fix tunneling so you can enjoy your favourite candles this season:

Prevention

When you light a candle for the first time, allow it to burn long enough to melt all the way to the edges of the candle jar. This ensures an even burn for the duration of your candle's life as wax has a "memory" so to speak. The first burn sets the tone for subsequent burns and will help you get the most burn-time out of your new candle.

If you find that your candles are constantly tunneling, despite letting the wax melt to the edges of the jar, consider buying higher quality candles. Most candles on the market are made of paraffin wax (a toxic byproduct of petroleum) and are more predisposed to tunneling. Higher grade waxes like coconut, soy, or beeswax burn cleaner, longer, and more evenly.

The Fix

If you have an old candle that's already tunneling, here are two easy ways to fix it:

- 1. Set your oven to 80°C (176°F) then remove anything flammable from your candle, such as labels or string. Once the oven is hot, place your candle on a baking tray for five minutes. This should heat the entire surface of the wax, making it smooth. With oven mitts, remove the candle and let it cool before lighting it.
- 2. Wrap aluminum foil around the top of your candle and angle it inwards like a dome. Ensure that the flame is far enough away from the foil and that there is still a hole to vent air. The foil will help the wax to heat up evenly. Keep a careful eye on your candle until the top layer of wax has melted, leaving a smooth surface, then remove the foil.

With these easy steps, you can enjoy your candles this season without any tunneling. If this article helped you, be sure to share it with a friend or loved one!

Springbank Hill Community Garden Horticultural Event Learnings

On the morning of Saturday, July 29, we were honoured to have Joanna Tschudy from the Calgary Horticultural Society give us a presentation. Joanna is the Community Development Coordinator for the CHS. Her talk was a 'seed to table' community garden discussion focussing on common garden bugs and weeds. Over 30 gardeners enjoyed the summer sunshine, the coffee and treats, and in particular, being exposed to Joanna's expertise.

In the spring of last year, Joanna gave us an introductory talk about gardening in raised beds, which plants to grow in a community garden, and how to get started. This year, her talk was mid-season, with our beds overflowing with vegetables and flowers. We had many gardening questions for her.

As gardeners, we typically try to get rid of pests that could possibly do any damage to our plants. But Joanna reminds us to keep an open mind and to 'know your enemies.' Bugs in the garden do not fall nicely into being good or bad and there is a large grey zone of outcomes. Her suggestion with any bug problem is 'when in doubt, do nothing.' For example, don't automatically try and remove an aphid infestation. They usually don't do much damage and the aphids are a fantastic food source for many birds.

It is best to not use any chemicals, particularly those ending in 'cide' (insecticide, herbicide, pesticide, fungicide). The main method to control any problem bugs is to first use a hose to jet water and physically remove them. Hand picking is sometimes also possible to reduce infestations. An ant hill can often be removed (or at least reduced) with repeated use of scalding water, rather than using specific ant-killing chemicals. Only in severe cases should 'death' chemicals be used, and then only with a detailed investigation and analysis of the problem and expert guidance. Our community garden is fully chemical free, so we must be very diligent about addressing bug issues promptly.

An interesting suggestion by Joanna is to plant a 'trap crop.' This is a plant that is specifically grown as a diversion. Usually, it is a fast-growing plant, like a radish, that attracts the pests so that the main crop, like carrots, can hopefully grow pest-free.



One problem in our garden is powdery mildew. This is a fungus that lives in the soil, and it creates a white, blotchy covering on some plants. Squash leaves are particularly susceptible. Rather than using fungicides it is best to remove the infected leaves (putting damaged foliage in the garbage rather than your compost), take care to water the soil and not the leaves, and make sure there is good air circulation through and around the plant. One home remedy is to spray the infected mildew (on both sides of the leaf) with milky water as the milk protein inhibits fungal growth.

With all bugs, it is important to determine what is the problem. Proper identification is needed before any corrective action can be taken. Some problems may be related to a chemical/soil deficiency; for example, blossom-end-rot (the black patch on the bottom of tomatoes or blackening of zucchini fruit) is caused by insufficient calcium in the plant tissue, which is usually caused by random watering. Other problems could be physical damage from hail, deer, voles, dogs, or children (and not from those pesky bugs). Careful analysis of the shape and type of hole may provide corrective guidance.

Weeds can generally be classified as any plant that is growing where it is unwanted. In Calgary, a common weed is the dandelion. We have a love-hate relationship with taraxacum officinale, particularly if we desire an immaculate green lawn. The City of Calgary is increasingly not cutting some grass areas to support dandelion and clover growth, which likely causes a large increase in complaints. But dandelions are often the first flowers to bloom for the early pollinators and could provide much better human nutrition than store bought lettuce.

Another invasive weed is the Canada thistle which is often the first plant to grow in disturbed soil (building sites and new gardens). One option is to use a physical barrier like thick mulch or to densely plant competing species. Either way, repeated pulling of thistles and dandelions (and any other weeds) will be needed to prevent them taking over! Note: plants are more easily removed if the soil is moist, so a good habit is to do some weeding immediately after a summer rainstorm.

In an extended and enthusiastic Q&A session, we had the opportunity to grill her with our specific questions. In summary, be experimental and plant something new every year, plant heirloom seeds that will germinate in less than 90 days, and thin out seedlings ('it is tough, but necessary' unless we want leaves and not fruit), and harvest garlic when the scapes do a double loop and the leaves are at least half brown.


