Neighbourhood Gardening Tip: How to Get Rid of Creeping Bellflower



Creeping bellflower (campanula rapunculoides) might look pretty, but don't be fooled—this invasive species is aggressive and can quickly take over your garden, lawn, and even spread into neighbouring yards. Once established it has deep, tuberous roots that make it hard to

remove, and it spreads by both root and seed.

Creeping bellflower is a perennial with heart-shaped leaves that grows to about a metre in height by summer and has purple/blue bell-shaped flowers. You may also know it by creeping campanula, garden bluebell, or another common name.

Here's How to Tackle It

Dig It Out (Carefully): Use a trowel or garden fork to dig deep and remove as much of the root as possible. Even small root fragments can regrow, so persistence is key.

Don't Compost It: Bag up all removed plant parts and dispose of in your black bin. Do not put these into your compost as that will continue the spread.

Cut Before It Flowers: If you can't remove it right away, cut off the purple flowers before they go to seed. Each plant can produce thousands of seeds!

Stay Persistent: Check the same spots regularly. It might take a few seasons to fully get rid of it, but consistent effort pays off.

Avoid Tilling: Tilling can break the roots into pieces, helping it spread even faster across your yard.

Pay Attention to Your Seed Mixes: In the springtime when planting seeds, make sure that any wildflower mixes you have do not include C. Rapunculoides (regular campanula species are okay though).

If you like the look of these flowers, please consider planting an alternative species that is not invasive, such as native bellflowers (e.g.: Carpathian Harebell), native and ornamental beardtongues (e.g.: Pink Chablis) or Blue Mirror Delphinium.

Let's work together to keep our gardens healthy and stop the spread of this invasive plant!

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How to Choose the Right Wine to Enjoy in Summer

I had a chance to interview, Bill Lavergne (owner of BKL Wine Merchants) about how to choose the right wine to enjoy in the summer. Hope you learn as much as I did from my chat with Bill.

What characteristics define a great summer wine?

A wine that has a light body, crisp acidity, low tannins (formed from grape skins, seeds, and stems) and is balanced (with no one characteristic of the wine standing out). Most people prefer their patio wines with pronounced fruity characteristics.

Are there any emerging trends or underrated wines you think people should try this summer?

Definitely Lambrusco! These sparkling wines are from the Lambrusco wine region in the Emilia-Romagna region; northeast of Tuscany and it is also the name of the grape varietal. There are at least 21 known Lambrusco varieties, however Sorbara and Salamino are two of the most common. The wine is chillable (even the reds!), light in body and delicious. Most typically you will find red Lambrusco in stores, but they come in various shades of rosé as well.

What regions produce the best summer-friendly wines?

Anywhere with a culture of sitting on a patio in beautiful weather tends to have good summer wines (e.g. the Mediterranean coastline). Some of the best values come from Northern Portugal and Spain.

How does serving temperature affect the taste of summer wines?

A rule of thumb is 'the sweeter or more aromatic the wine the cooler you should serve it'. A lower temperature makes sugars less noticeable; but can also make tannins appear harsher and some aromas and flavours are muted. Some recommendations are:

- Sauvignon Blanc, Pinot Grigio, Gewurtzraminer, etc. (not oaked) – Serve cooler as they are much more aromatic. Serve directly from the fridge.
- Chardonnay (not oaked) A more neutral grape. Remove from the fridge ten minutes before serving.
- Oaked wines or light-bodied reds have more tannins, so serve with a lighter chill.



What Is your stance on chilling red wines for warm-weather drinking?

Bill highly recommends doing this. Place the bottle in the fridge for five to ten minutes before serving.

If you could drink only one wine all summer, which would it be?

Paltrinieri 'Piria' Lambrusco Rosé. It is affordable, with gorgeous red fruit aromas and flavours along with a creamy texture and fine bubbles. You can pair it with almost anything or just enjoy on its own.

What's one unique wine-related experience or memory that stands out to you?

Bill has had the opportunity to enjoy vertical tastings (series of vintages from a single wine) with two different well-known wines. One vertical consisted of over a dozen vintages, the other a half-dozen. Bill and others at the tastings agreed that the best vintages do not always correlate with the best tasting wine once aged. Good producers make great wines almost every year, and you may be surprised by the quality of the wine from less expensive vintages.



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Springbank Hill Farm Stand 2025

We are pleased to announce that Springbank Hill is once again partnering with FreshPal Farms, based in Olds, Alberta, to host a weekly farm stand. FreshPal Farms boasts a unique commercial passive solar greenhouse. Unlike traditional greenhouses, a passive solar greenhouse does not rely on solar panels, heaters, or fossil fuels for energy. Instead, it utilizes polymer plastic on its roof and south-facing wall to harness all of its required energy from the sun. The north-facing wall of the greenhouse is constructed with one-meter-thick clay, which effectively captures and stores solar heat, releasing it slowly at night. This innovative design allows FreshPal Farms to cultivate certain plants year-round.

In addition, they enrich the soil through the use of compost and manure while avoiding the use of pesticides, herbicides, or fungicides. The produce sold at the farm stand is picked ripe and brought directly to Springbank Hill, ensuring maximum freshness and quality.

FreshPal Farms will offer their famous delicious thin-skinned tomato varieties, of which they grow almost 30,000 lbs each year. Additionally, they will also have cucumbers, muskmelons, watermelons, peppers, eggplants, pole beans, squash, cabbages, broccoli, cauliflower, Bok choy, spinach, green onion, basil, and dill weed during the season. You can find FreshPal Farms' farmers market stand on Saturdays. We look forward to seeing you there!

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






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
