

Spring Hiking Tips

Hiking in the spring offers a wonderful opportunity to explore the natural beauty of the region as the landscape comes to life after the winter months. Here are some tips for spring hiking:

- Check Trail Condition: Spring can bring melting snow, muddy trails, and potential hazards like slippery surfaces. Check trail conditions and closures before heading out to ensure a safe and enjoyable hike.
- Dress in Layers: Spring weather in Calgary can be variable, with cool mornings and warmer afternoons. Dress in layers that can be easily added or removed to stay comfortable throughout your hike
- Wear Proper Footwear: Trails may be muddy or wet in the spring, so wear sturdy and waterproof hiking boots with good traction to navigate varying terrain safely.
- Be Bear Aware: Spring is when bears start becoming active after hibernation. Be bear aware by making noise while hiking, carrying bear spray, and knowing how to react if you encounter wildlife.
- **Stay on Designated Trails:** Stick to designated trails to protect fragile vegetation and wildlife habitats. Avoid creating new trails or shortcuts that can damage the ecosystem.

Grilled Lemon Herb Chicken with Spring Pea Risotto



As the days grow longer and the air fills with the sweet promise of blooming flowers, it's time to welcome the flavours of spring into our kitchens. In this recipe, we invite you to embark on a culinary journey that celebrates the freshness and vibrancy of the season with a delightful pairing of Grilled Lemon Herb Chicken and Spring Pea Risotto.

Grilled Lemon Herb Chicken

Ingredients:

- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts
- ¼ cup olive oil
- Juice of 2 lemons
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- Salt and pepper to taste

Instructions:

- 1. In a bowl, whisk together olive oil, lemon juice, minced garlic, oregano, thyme, salt, and pepper.
- 2. Place the chicken breasts in a resealable plastic bag or shallow dish and pour the marinade over them. Ensure the chicken is coated evenly. Marinate in the refrigerator for at least 30 minutes.
- 3. Preheat the grill to medium-high heat.
- Grill the chicken breasts for about six to seven minutes per side or until they are cooked through and have nice grill marks.
- 5. Remove from the grill and let them rest for a few minutes before serving.

Spring Pea Risotto

Ingredients:

- 1 cup Arborio rice
- 4 cups chicken or vegetable broth
- 1 cup fresh or frozen peas
- ½ cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 cup white wine
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 small onion, finely chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- Salt and pepper to taste

Instructions:

- 1. In a saucepan, heat the broth until simmering, then reduce the heat to low to keep it warm.
- In a separate large pan, melt the butter over medium heat. Add the chopped onion and garlic, sauté until softened.
- 3. Add the Arborio rice to the pan and stir to coat the grains with butter.
- 4. Pour in the white wine and cook until it is absorbed by the rice.
- Begin adding the warm broth one ladle at a time, stirring constantly, and allowing each addition to be absorbed before adding more.
- When the rice is almost cooked (after about 18 to 20 minutes), stir in the peas and continue cooking until they are heated through.
- 7. Remove the pan from heat, stir in the Parmesan cheese, and season with salt and pepper.
- 8. Serve the grilled lemon herb chicken alongside the spring pea risotto for a delicious and satisfying meal. Enjoy!



Preparing for Drought Season

Even though the City does not currently have any water restrictions in place, they are encouraging Calgarians to continue to seek out ways they can use water wisely inside the home. This can include fixing leaks, taking shorter showers, and only doing full loads of laundry. As Calgarians look ahead to spring and the likelihood of outdoor water restrictions, the City encourages Calgarians to consider ways they can adapt their yards and gardens to use less water and to seek out ways they can conserve water inside the home.

The City of Calgary is proactively accelerating plans, procedures, and communications to be ready for a drought or water shortage situation and will ensure that citizens and businesses are informed along the way. They are planning extensive communications to provide Calgarians with the support and information they need to take action to conserve water and use it wisely.

Making small changes in our daily water use in the home can add up to make a difference. Washing only full loads in your laundry and dishwasher, turning off the tap while shaving or brushing your teeth, or taking shorter showers, can help a typical household save water, which saves money on their utility bill too.

As Calgarians look ahead to spring and plan their garden, they're encouraged to prepare their yard for dry conditions. Adding mulch to gardens will help reduce evaporation and installing a rain barrel (or two) will capture rainwater to use for watering gardens and plants. If you are planning new landscaping or gardening projects this year, use drought-tolerant native plants.

Businesses can also do their part to make a difference by making water-efficient choices. Start by identifying essential and less essential water uses and seeing if there are potential water savings opportunities – from fixing leaks to installing water efficient fixtures.

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
