#### **Spring Vegetable Risotto**

As the days grow longer and the weather warms up, it's the perfect time to enjoy fresh, seasonal ingredients. This Spring Vegetable Risotto is not only creamy and comforting but also packed with vibrant vegetables that celebrate spring flavours.



#### **Ingredients**

- 1 cup Arborio rice
- 4 cups vegetable broth
- 1 cup asparagus, chopped
- 1 cup peas
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- ½ cup Parmesan cheese, grated
- Olive oil
- Salt and pepper to taste

#### Instructions

- 1. Heat olive oil in a pan over medium heat. Add the onion and garlic, sautéing until translucent.
- 2. Add the Arborio rice, stirring for one to two minutes to toast the rice slightly.
- 3. Gradually add the vegetable broth, one ladle at a time, stirring continuously until each addition is absorbed.
- 4. In the last ten minutes of cooking, add the chopped asparagus and peas.
- 5. Once the rice is creamy and cooked to al dente, stir in the Parmesan cheese, salt, and pepper.
- 6. Serve warm and enjoy the flavours of spring!

Calgarians will soon see big savings on their Blue Cart fee, which will drop to just \$2.17 per month—that's a \$7.17 per month savings for every household!



# How to Prevent CO Build-Up in Your Home

#### **Yearly Tips:**

- Every year check all the fuel-burning appliances in your house; make sure they are working properly and used properly.
- Make sure fuel-burning appliances, chimneys, and vents are cleaned and inspected by professionals every year before you start to use them, usually when the weather gets cold.

#### **Indoor Tips:**

- Never use the stove or oven to heat your home.
- Make sure to open the flue of your fireplace before you use it.
- Never run a car, vehicle, or other motor inside a garage, even if the garage door is open. Always drive your car or vehicle out of the garage right after starting it.

#### **Outdoor Tips:**

- Make sure your vents for the dryer, furnace, stove, fireplace, and other fuel-burning appliances are always clear of snow and other debris.
- Only use gas and charcoal barbeques outdoors, away from all doors, windows, vents, and other building openings. Never use barbeques inside a garage, even if the garage door is open.
- Only use portable fuel-burning generators outdoors in well-ventilated areas away from windows, doors, vents, and other building openings.
- Make sure portable fuel-burning heaters are vented properly, according to their instructions.
- Check the outside and inside walls of your house for cracks, holes, separations, and check for rust, stains, or carbon deposits on heating ducts or pipes.
- Check the flame on fuel-burning appliances it should be clear blue with occasional yellow tips.



#### **Right Tree, Right Location**

Planting your own tree can be a little daunting. The City of Calgary's 2025 Right Tree, Right Location inperson workshops are now open for registration. This course will help you choose and plant a new tree in your yard. The workshops take place from early March to early April.

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# Calgary Fire Department Deaf and Hard-Of-Hearing Program

The Calgary Fire Department (CFD) launched a new program, funded by The City of Calgary's Equity in Service Delivery Fund, to provide free specialized smoke and carbon monoxide alerting devices for eligible Deaf and hard-of-hearing residents, enhancing fire safety and inclusivity.

Traditional smoke and carbon monoxide alarms rely on high-pitched audio alerts, which can be ineffective for those with hearing loss. Assistive alerting devices address this challenge by incorporating:

- Flashing strobe lights that provide a visual warning of smoke or carbon monoxide detection.
- Bed or pillow shakers that vibrate to wake individuals during emergencies.
- Loud, low-pitched audio signals specifically designed for individuals with hearing loss.

Since 1996, CFD's Home Safety Program has visited over 500,000 homes and installed nearly 35,000 traditional smoke alarms. This new program builds on that legacy, focusing on the unique needs of the Deaf and hard-of-hearing community. With \$100,000 allocated to the overall program, CFD continues its commitment to equitable fire safety for all Calgarians.

To qualify for these free devices, applicants must:

- · Self-identify as Deaf or hard of hearing.
- Reside within Calgary city limits.
- Participate in financial support programs such as Assured Income for the Severely Handicapped (AISH) or Fair Entry.

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# Sarcee Trail/Bow Trail Functional Planning Study

#### **Project Overview**

The Sarcee Bow FPS aims to develop a functional plan that improves connectivity, enhances safety, and supports long-term growth in the area. The project seeks to validate recommendations from the 2012 Council-approved West Springs Area Structure Plan. Key objectives include improving traffic flow at the intersection and corridors in the surrounding area, with considerations for the possible expansion of both the Sarcee Trail and Bow Trail corridors.

#### **Engagement Highlights**

To ensure the recommended plan meets the needs and priorities of the community, we have engaged closely with interest-holders throughout the process.

Phase 1 (April 2024): Identified high-level themes such as the desire to improve pedestrian and wheeling accessibility and connectivity, the importance of environmental and green space conservation and the need to improve traffic flow and intersection safety within the study area.

Phase 2 (November 2024): We presented two interchange options and gathered the communities' feedback on the proposed plans. The high-level feedback we heard included support for an interchange to improve traffic flow and safety, mixed feedback regarding the proposed direct access to Edworthy Park from Bow Trail SW, desire for improved pedestrian and wheeling connectivity and the importance of green space conservation.

The Phase 2 What We Heard Report has been posted to the project webpage.



#### **Next Steps**

Based on feedback regarding Edworthy Park access, the Sarcee/Bow Trail team plans to host focused engagement sessions with the Wildwood community in the coming months, to explore preferences on park access further. The public will be notified once these sessions are scheduled.

Phase 3 engagement is set to begin in spring 2025. During this phase the Sarcee/Bow Trail team will present the final recommended plan and collect input for any refinements.
